

Wherever My Basket Lands I'm in God's Hands

Back in the days of Moses all newborn Hebrew baby boys, by law, had to be thrown into the Nile River and drowned.

The name Moses means "Pulled Out" because Pharaoh's daughter pulled him out of the water. In response to the cries of his people in slavery, God literally birthed Moses to pull them out of Egypt and rescue them. But before he did that through Moses as an adult, he pictured that in Moses as a child. Little Moses was pulled out, because Big Moses was called to pull others out.

The same is true of you. You might not be a Moses who delivers an entire nation, but you are a Pulled-Out-One whom God is raising up to bring freedom to many. God let your *basket* land, because you've always been in his hand.

Key Verse

*When she could no longer hide him, she got a **basket** made of papyrus reeds and waterproofed it with tar and pitch. She put the baby in the basket and laid it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile River.*

Exodus 2:3

Click

Your child will be able to state the meaning of this Bible verse in their own words.

Stick

The life application meaning of this verse is tied to the image of a **basket**.



Click-er: Basket

Whenever you see, carry, or think about a *basket*, let this HoneyWord weave itself into your heart as it clicks and sticks.

Read Exodus 2:3

Make-it-Stick

Find an old *basket* and pretend it has some of your most valuable possessions in it. Repeat this HoneyWord Lesson as you throw the *basket* in the air and let it land on the ground. Remember, there's a big difference between how you handle your *basket* and how God handles you in his "basket." To throw your *basket*, you have to let go. But God never lets go of you. Never, ever. You'll always be safe in his hands.

Everyone Take Turns Explaining the Meaning of this Lesson in Your Own Words

Ask, "What does this lesson mean?" If the answer is in the ballpark of the correct meaning, praise that person out loud. Then ask another to explain it. Do this 2 or 3 times in a row.

Hold Up the Click-er

Hold up the Click-er (basket) and say this HoneyWord Lesson out loud:

"Wherever my basket lands, I'm in God's hands."

Then repeat it out loud together one more time.

Pair Up in Small Groups of Two

If you're with more than one child, have your children pair up and ask each other to say the lesson out loud to each other.

Re-Group and Recite Again

Ask one child to say the lesson one more time, and then explain what it means.
